Description of the organization

The Ocean & Climate Platform (OCP) is a multi-stakeholder network with more than 100 members: NGOs, scientific organizations, universities, research institutions, foundations, public institutions, business associations and local authorities. OCP's objective is to raise awareness among the public, scientists and political decision-makers of the importance of the interlinkages between ocean, climate and biodiversity.

- Drafting articles and policy briefs about ocean-climate issues
- Event planning, following-up and minute-taking in meetings

Requirements:

- Excellent writing skills and ability to work with little supervision
- Excellent ability to review and synthesize scientific articles
