Description

The Ocean and Climate Platform is a multi-stakeholder network with more than 100 members: NGOs, scientific organisations, universities, research institutions, foundations, public institutions, business associations and local authorities. OCP's objective is to raise awareness among the public, scientists and political decision-makers of the importance of the interlinkages between Ocean, Climate and Biodiversity. The communication intern will work in collaboration with the science and advocacy teams to support the dissemination of the various projects.

The Intern's responsibilities will include:

• Communication support:

- Draft a wide range of communication materials including meeting reports, conference documents, blog articles, press releases
- Participate in the elaboration and the implementation of a communication strategy focused on the ocean elements of the IPCC AR6 synthesis
- Update the Platform's social media accounts (Twitter, LinkedIn) and the website (WordPress)

Network animation support:

- Creation of content around ocean-climate-biodiversity solutions
- Create a weekly ocean-climate watch
- Assist with the internal communication of the network (mailing, newsletter, etc.)
- Assist with the organization of the annual OCP members seminar
- Assist with the organization of regular meetings and events with network members

Skills and qualifications:

- Excellent command of both **English** and **French** (oral and written)

- Strong organizational skills and ability to work with minimum supervision
- Strong knowledge of international environmental affairs and governance (Scientific knowledge allowing a good understanding of the relationship between ocean, climate and biodiversity
