

## Internship offer: International Policy Support

<u>About the Ocean & Climate Platform</u>: The Ocean & Climate Platform (OCP) is a multistakeholder network with more than 110 international members: NGOs, scientific institutes, universities, foundations, public institutions, business associations and local authorities. The OCP's objective is to raise awareness among the public, scientists and political decision-makers of the importance of the interlinkages between Ocean, Climate and Biodiversity.

The intern's responsibilities will include:

- Assist with policy activities on the ocean-climate-biodiversity nexus (e.g., revision of the 2019 OCP Policy Recommendations, preparation of policy briefs and position papers), and followup of international processes (e.g., UNFCCC, CBD, UNGA).
- Assist with the coordination of mobilisation activities, particularly in preparation for UNFCCC COP30 (10-21 November 2025 – Belem, Brazil), including as part of the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action and the Ocean Breakthroughs campaign.
- Assist with the organisation of international meetings, events and workshops, including the Ocean Action Day at COP30.
- Conduct independent research on ocean-climate-biodiversity related topics and draft a wide range of information materials (e.g., meeting reports, factsheets, blog articles and policy briefs) and other support documents (e.g., visuals, PowerPoint).

## Skills and qualifications:

- Excellent command of both English and French (oral and written)
- Strong ability to work with little supervision
- Strong organisational skills and attention to details

- · Knowledge of international environmental affairs and governance
