



Internship offer: Global Climate Engagement Support

About us: The Ocean & Climate Platform (OCP) is an international network of more than 120 organisations from civil society (NGOs, scientific institutes, universities, foundations, public institutions, businesses, and local authorities). Together, they work at the science-policy interface to promote scientific expertise on the major role played by the ocean in the global climate system, and to advocate for better consideration of these interactions by decision-makers.

The intern's responsibilities will include:

- Support the OCP's policy and advocacy activities within the UNFCCC space in preparation for Pacific Pre-COP and COP31, in particular:
 - the coordination of civil society around key policy priorities and asks,
 - the advancement and promotion of the Blue NDC Challenge,
 - the organisation of a climate negotiator convening.
- Support the OCP's international mobilisation activities within the UNFCCC space in preparation for Pacific Pre-COP and COP31, most notably:
 - the coordination and delivery of the Ocean Breakthroughs campaign,
 - the engagement with the Action Agenda's group dedicated to preserving and restoring coastal and marine ecosystems, including the advancement of the Blue Package Plan to Accelerate Solutions
- Assist with the organisation of international meetings, events and workshops related to the UNFCCC Pacific Pre-COP (October 2026) and COP31 (November 2026).
- Draft a wide range of information materials (e.g., meeting minutes, factsheets, and blog articles) and other support documents (e.g., visuals, PowerPoint).

Skills and qualifications:

- Excellent command of both English and French (written and oral)
- Strong ability to work with little supervision
- Strong organisational skills and attention to details
- Excellent writing skills
- Strong research and analysis skills
- Knowledge of international environmental affairs and governance

Academic background: Be enrolled in a masters' degree in environmental policy, political science, international relations or equivalent.
